

COMMON ROOFING SHINGLES


CLAY TILES

Longer lasting than asphalt or cedar shingles without as much maintenance, these tiles are made to handle the sun as well as sudden downpours. With a lifespan of 50 years, tiles are very heavy and roof structures may need more support to handle the extra weight.



METAL ROOFING

One of the longest lasting roofing materials on the market, but you'll pay for that longevity. Becoming more popular in residential use, they can made with different profiles and a wide variety of colors. Resisting moss, algae, rust, and more, maintenance is easy.



SLATE TILES
